



Age Group: 2-5 year-olds

Date: September 13, 2020

Big Idea: God the father, Jesus the son, and the Holy Spirit are three in one.

Scripture: Philippians 4:20 *Give glory to our God and Father for ever and ever. Amen.* (NIRV)

Activities:

- **Large Motor Activity:** How Big Is God?

Materials: large object (like a building, flag pole, or water tower)

- As you are driving with your child(ren) or walking around your neighborhood, keep an eye out for something really big, like a tall building, a water tower, or giant flag pole. As the object is in the distance, ask your child(ren) to describe to you how big it is. (They will likely say it's not very big!) Then either walk or drive to the object. It will look so much bigger when you see it up close! Ask them how you could show other people how big the object is. (Maybe you could take a picture of them next to the object to show others how big it is.)
- Then tell your child(ren) that God is bigger than we can imagine too! When we think and talk about Him, He might seem small. But as we get to know Him by reading the Bible and by praying, we can start to understand how big God really is! He is bigger than anything or anyone we could ever imagine! How amazing that we get to love and obey a God that is so big! And because God is so big and amazing, we can tell other people about how big He is!

- **Fine Motor Activity:** God Is Beautiful!

Materials: paper, watercolor paints, paintbrush, or crayons or markers

- Depending on when your child(ren) gets up or goes to bed, try to take a morning or evening and watch a sunrise or sunset together. If this isn't possible, look at pictures of sunrises and sunsets together. Discuss how the sunset is so beautiful and that it reflects, or shows, some of God's beauty to us. God is so amazing and beautiful and we can catch glimpses of His beauty through His creation! And when we see the beauty in what God makes and that He is beautiful and valuable and worth all of our celebration, we give Him the glory he deserves.
 - Then have your child create a drawing or a painting of a sunrise or sunset. Encourage them that their picture reflects some of the beauty they have as a person. God made us in His image and we reflect, or show that image to the world. When we create something, we are also showing the world some of who God is.
